



Dear Parents/Carers,

This wasn't quite the start to the year that we expected. Thank you for being so patient and understanding in light of the recent Government changes for primary schools. We have been busy putting together remote learning and it has been great to see the positive response from families on both Teams and Tapestry. Here are some of your comments and questions:

You said	Our response
Pupils are enjoying the range of work being offered remotely	We will continue to incorporate a wide range of activities to teach a broad and balanced curriculum, which will be a combination of screen based and non-screen based activities.
There appeared to be a lot of work set for each pupil	The Government has produced guidance for remote learning which states that pupils in Key Stage 1/Early Years should have at least 3 hours learning per day and 4 hours for pupils in Key Stage 2.
The deadline for submitting work seemed quite quick – particularly when there was more than one child completing work	There will be greater flexibility about handing in dates. The expectation remains that all tasks are done.
You preferred the tasks being assigned at different points during the day rather than all in one go	We have scheduled the assignments to coincide with the learning they would normally receive in school
Work uploaded onto Teams are sometimes difficult to edit	-We will upload a blank document with each task for pupils to type into if editing the task in problematic. -Pupils are able to complete work on paper and either upload to teams or discuss during calls with their class teacher
Is there a function for parents to ask teachers questions about their child's learning?	Yes -During calls with class teacher -By phoning school requesting a conversation with the class teacher -By replying to the assignment on to the general page on Teams
Will there be live sessions?	This is the next step in our blended learning plan. Guidance and support on accessing live sessions will be distributed soon.
