

Year 1 Week 1 – My Family

Weekly Maths Tasks

- Work on [Numberbots](#)
- Play number bond games such as [Hit the Button](#); [hit the correct target](#)
- Write numbers to 20 in words and numerals.
- Look around your house to see what 2D and 3D shapes you can find.
- Discuss different times of the day when events happen such as breakfast, lunch and dinner.
- Help parents/family members when cooking to weigh out ingredients.
- Try cutting up different pieces of food into quarters and halves.

Weekly Reading tasks

- Share a family favourite book and discuss what you liked and disliked about the story.
- Complete different phonics activities on [Phonics Play](#)
- Read or listen to a story and write a book review. What did you like about it? Would you recommend it to your friends?
- Retell your favourite story – you could turn it into a comic strip to help you remember the key parts. Maybe you and your family could retell the story together with actions or acting out the different characters.

Weekly writing tasks

- Write a diary about your week and the activities you have completed with your family. You could draw or take pictures to show what you have done – write a caption for each picture. Create a scrap book of these memories.
- Write a set of instructions on how to wash your hands and test it out with a family member.
- Make a family tree and write about the members of your family and why they are important to you.
- Write a letter or postcard to a member of your family (who doesn't live with you) telling them what you've been up to. Look at different postcards and try decorating the front of yours.

Learning project

The project this week gives opportunities for you to learn more about your family.

- Research fun facts about your family by finding out what they like, what they don't like e.g. favourite foods, favourite books, etc.
- Draw a family portrait. Think about the position of your eyes, ears, nose and mouth.
- Look at photos of you when you were younger and identify how you have changed.
- Using recyclable materials create a junk model of yourself or your home. Draw and label your design and then carefully choose the materials you want to use to make it.
